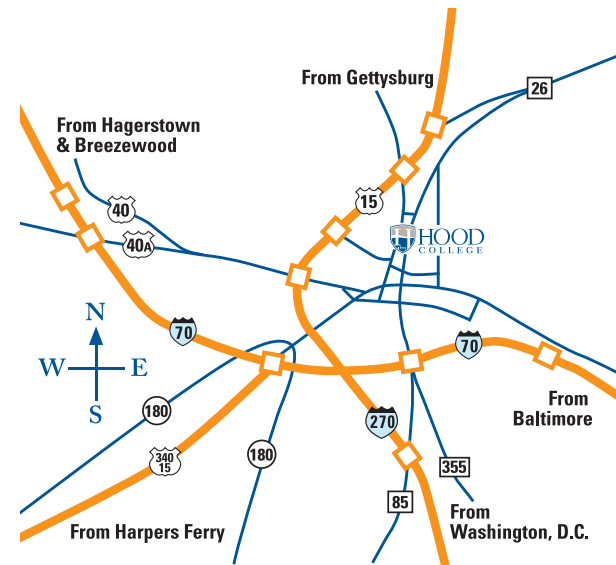

FROM THE NORTH: Follow I-95 south (New Jersey Turnpike) through Delaware to the junction with the Baltimore Beltway (I-695). Then follow I-695 west (Towson) to the exit for I-70 west. Once on I-70, follow the directions from Baltimore.

FROM BALTIMORE: Follow I-70 west from Baltimore to Frederick. Exit onto Route 15 north. Follow 15 north to Rosemont Avenue exit. Turn left onto Rosemont. Travel one-half mile and turn left at the entrance to Hood.

FROM WASHINGTON: Follow I-270 northwest from Washington to the junction with I-70 and Route 15. Follow Route 15 north to Rosemont Avenue exit. Turn left onto Rosemont. Travel one-half mile and turn left at the entrance to Hood.

FROM THE WEST: Follow I-70 east from Hagerstown. Take the 52B exit to Route 15 north. Follow Route 15 north to Rosemont Avenue exit. Turn left onto Rosemont. Travel one-half mile and turn left at the entrance to Hood.
